# Minutes

08/05/2010

- I. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 by President Mark Rosen who asked all members to sign up for activities the club is organizing. Mark briefly discussed recent judicial rulings that found California's Proposition 8 to be unconstitutional and Arizona's anti-immigration law to have many unconstitutional components.
  - A. Visitors Paulette Walter and Dave Arbuckle were welcomed.
- II. There were no additions to the agenda.
- III. The minutes of the July 1, 2010 meeting were approved unanimously.
- IV. A framed letter of appreciation recognizing the significant contribution of Trish Grenfell to AADC in recent years was read and presented by past president Leslye Janusz.
- V. Old Business.
  - A. Mark Rosen reported on the success of AADC's group participation in Auburn's 4th of July parade. Our Spirit of '76 musical contribution and our support of congressional candidate Clint Curtis were highly effective in meeting our goal of projecting a positive presence of Democratic Party members in mid-Placer County.
  - B. Karen Tajbl provided an update on the club's Books for Inmate's project, commending members and local used bookstore Winston Smith Books for contributing a good variety of paperbacks.
  - C. Karen Tajbl and Paul Berger described the success of AADC's participation in the Democratic Party registration table at Galleria. Rosalie Wohlfromm and Patricia Burke were cited for their volunteer work in the voter registration project.
  - D. Trish Grenfell spoke about the AADC letters to the editor project, noting that so far no members have volunteered to write letters of response to letters stating ultra-conservative or reactionary positions.
  - E. Patricia Burke submitted the treasurer's report and conducted the 50/50 raffle drawing.
- VI. New Business.
  - A. Leslye Janusz, circulated a sign up sheet for members to volunteer to at the booth. She described the role of booth sitters in registering voters, speaking in support of Democratic candidates etc.
  - B. Leslye Janusz previewed the Latitudes Fundraiser, urging members to volunteer and to provide items for the silent auction. Treasurer Pat Burke dispersed tickets to members to sell in the community. Flyers announcing the Latitudes event were passed out to be distributed community-wide.
- VII. Announcements. Paul Berger announced that the AADC Meeting on Sept. 2 will feature a forum on the Marijuana legalization initiative which will appear on the November ballot statewide. Paul has secured speakers on both sides of the issue and the expectation is that this should garner significant community interest.
- VIII. At 7:30 Tina Andolina, the Legislative Director for the Planning and Conservation League gave members a thorough picture of the intricate political interplay behind Proposition 18, the \$22,000,000,000 Water Bond on the November ballot. The position of PCL on this and other water projects is they should be ecologically sound and that tax payers should not be footing the bill for projects that benefit special interests such as giant agri-business concerns who stand to use much of the water at bargain rates.
